A few weeks ago, I had the opportunity to receive a visit from the President of the Genesee County Chamber of Commerce. He had been touring Genesee County communities in his new position in order to become reacquainted with areas he had not recently visited. After driving through our village, he took a uturn and drove through a second time taking in the changes that have taken place since he had been here. After his tour, he stopped by the office to share his visit with me.
