Thank you to everyone who participated in the Tree Lighting Parade that took the place of our Annual Tree lighting in Ward Park. Mr. and Mrs. Claus, the fire department with brightly decorated trucks, elves Nancy Bailey, Anne Sapienza, and Eliana Peralta Sapienza, joined with me to bring Christmas Cheer to the village.

Your patience during the 2 weeks the office was closed due to staff quarantining due to a village employee contracting COVID 19 was greatly appreciated. All services to residents during that time remained uninterrupted with everyone's help, including snow removal.

The Planning Board has welcomed newly appointed member Carol Walker; Carol has jumped right in working on the Zoning Law updates and helping to carryout planning board business.

Spring plans are coming together for roadwork, sidewalk repairs, and parking lot coating in the village. A rebuild of the entrance to Hickory Park is also planned. These projects were put on hold from last spring and summer due to the pandemic.

Work has begun on the 5th building participating in the Main Street Grant program; façade work and interior work is taking place at 23-25 N Lake Ave. All projects will be completed by April.

No decisions have been made on whether or not to pursue a local law for the keeping of chickens in the village. Please consider attending the February information meeting if you have questions. 
The Village Office will be closed Monday, February 15th in honor of President's Day,

Gypsy moths have been spotted in the village; this moth is a significant pest because the caterpillars have voracious appetites for more than 300 species of trees and shrubs, posing a danger to North America's forests. The caterpillars defoliate trees, leaving trees vulnerable to diseases and other pests and can eventually kill the tree. Please email us if you observe these moths so we can submit a report to the DEC.
