Mayor's Message

I would like to start this newsletter welcoming Conte Auto to our village. This auto repair shop is located at 8121 Buffalo Road in the former Caesars Auto building. We wish you the best in your new business endeavor.

With the warm weather we have recently experienced I have noticed many residents walking their dogs. Please-Please-Please be responsible pet owners and pick up after your pets. I have received resident concerns pertaining to this issue.

In last month's newsletter I wrote that I would be addressing the infrastructure of our electric system. Our system has undergone a massive rebuild making it arguably the best in the state. New poles, conductors, pole and pad mount transformers and all LED street lighting are in place, but the heart of an electric utility is its substation. The substation receives power from a transmission line and in turn lowers the voltage to be utilized on the overhead conductors on the poles throughout the village. The benchmark of a substation life is forty years. Our current station equipment is from 1984 and with a projected lead time of five years to engineer and build a new station we would be looking at 44 years of service from our Gibson Place substation. Another issue is the lack of capacity at our current substation to meet the needs of tomorrow. Electric automobiles and heat pumps which replace fossil fuels to heat our homes are good examples of increased load on a system. We must plan accordingly to meet the demands for decades to come. At the February 8th Board of Trustees meeting the board voted in favor of hiring PLM Engineering to conduct a scope of services study to review the distribution system and develop an upgrade plan for the Village of Bergen electric system. PLM anticipates the study will take approximately six months to complete. The results of the study will be forthcoming when available through this newsletter.
